Application

It can be used to shape our views of sacrifice and the nature of worship. *?Therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, I urge you to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God; this is your spiritual worship.?*
2. Which words describe the kind of sacrifice our bodies are to be?
3. How does such sacrifice amount to spiritual worship?

Connection

1. When do you experience such living sacrifice and worship in your sporting life?
2. When do you get a sense that your athletic sacrifices are holy and pleasing to God?
3. What are some sacrifices that may be required for your team to fulfill its goals this season?

Discovery

Think about what God's role is for you on your team. Is there anything He is asking you to sacrifice to fulfill this role? Make a list of potential obstacles that might hinder your sacrifice and how, with the help of Christ, you can overcome each of them.
