One week later, Dave and my good friend Jon went for a joy ride in Dave's classic car. This ride turned fatal, and Dave was killed in an accident. If it had not been for his sister over the break, Dave would have been lost for eternity.

Like the teammate at the retreat, or me many years ago, many people assume that Huddle friends are believers like them. But do they really know? Do YOU really know? If not, what are you waiting for? Find out for sure! Don't wait until it's too late. Good thing for Dave and this new follower from the retreat, they made room for Jesus to come in and take over their hearts. Please take time to find out where your Huddle members stand. And if they don't know for sure, point them to Romans 10:9. There is always room for one more!
