There was always adversity, and every team had different issues to overcome, but I always enjoyed the challenge of helping them to get back up after being knocked down.

For me, the hardest part of the job wasn?t losing in OT or dealing with rifts within the team. By far, the most difficult part was the first two days of practice when I would have to tell some players that they didn?t make the team. Our policy when making cuts was to bring every player in to let them know whether they made the team or not. Seeing the pain in their eyes when I gave them the bad news always made my heart sink. We always encouraged them to work hard and try out again next season, but most of them decided not to come back out. I always wished we could keep 20 to 25 kids, but there weren?t enough uniforms, and playing time would have been limited. Have you ever been cut from a team like that? It?s not fun at all. But sometimes it?s inevitable.

The coaches have to make tough decisions based on factors like the uniforms and time on the court. Sometimes, in sports, there are just necessary cuts. But here?s the great news. In life, Christ?our ?Coach??has a team, and everyone who tries out makes it! He gives a uniform to everyone who wants to join! Unlike a basketball team, there is always room for more players, and our Coach even wants us to go out and recruit more (Mark 16:15). He also wants His

players to work hard in practice and know the offense (2 Timothy 2:15). He wants us to always strive to be our best for Him (1 Corinthians 9:25), and to show love to our opponents (Matthew 5:44). Truly, He's the greatest Coach with the best team ever! If you haven't joined Christ's team, tryouts are anytime. And, don't worry, you won't be cut. He accepts any and all who call on His name. If you are already on Christ's team, make sure you are practicing as hard as you can—reading your Bible, praying and finding others to join His squad. And, remember, if you follow His instructions, you will be blessed. He wants us all to be MVPs.
