

## Am I Coachable?

### **Ready:**

### **Set**

If you have played sports for any time, you have been lectured on learning to be “coachable.”

Being coachable is one of the most important lessons a young athlete can learn. As you can imagine, a lot of pride is associated with someone who is not coachable. From the outside, it looks foolish to see someone not even be open to learning something new, a better path.

How much pride must we have to believe that we know than the Creator of the universe? Most of the time, we cling to what we know due to fear of the unknown. If we let go of our plan, what if there is no plan to replace what we had? We must have faith that when we open our hands and lay our plan down at the feet of Jesus, He will hand us back something far better than we could have ever imagined.

The moment the uncoachable kid trusts their coach and waits for them to show them a new path, they usually learn a new skill. More often than not, this new skill makes them better players and sets them on a new path forward.
