And it is important to note that Job didn't quit competing until the very end.

As you compete today against Satan, our arch rival, notice that you are becoming closer to the Coach as well as your teammates. The Lord chose Job to endure the trials because He knew Job would compete with all his heart. Job's faith was strong. He was prepared for battle. He was prepared to compete. Job had put on the armor of God and was able to recognize and react to the tactics of Satan.
