In the 2014 NCAA Championship, the University of Connecticut men's basketball team was the underdog no one believed could win. But after UConn won, their second-year head coach, Kevin Ollie, said, "They believed in a vision before anyone could see it. They stuck with it through down times when we were losing. When we were winning, they stayed together, and they believed it was possible." (ESPN, 2014)

Just one month prior, UConn lost to Louisville by 33 points. After the game, UConn's point guard, Shabazz Napier, walked into the locker room and told the team that they would be holding the National Championship trophy one month later. Everyone in that locker room believed him.
