Set

As Christians, there are times when we find ourselves in roles with responsibilities that we may not desire. But according to His purpose and plan, these roles are placed in front of us for a reason? a godly reason.

It took Esther some time to understand that her new role as Queen of Vashti was the specific place that God had intentionally planned for her to be. A humble and simple woman, Esther did not desire to be queen; she never asked to live in a palace nor did she request power, she only loved God deeply and desired that her people were taken care of.

When she found out that there was a plan for Jews throughout the empire to be killed, her cousin reminded her that the role she had been given was a respected one. Esther had the opportunity to influence her King's decision and save her people from destruction. It was then when she realized that even though she would have never decided to become queen if given the option, God had a plan for her beyond what she could have imagined.

If Esther had never become queen, the Jewish people would have been killed. God chose Esther to fulfill His plan and equipped her with the strength, courage, and confidence she would need to speak to her King and convince him to save her people.
