How willing are you to take chances and express yourself in conversation and proclaim the truth about Christ?

As Christians, we aren't called to be silent with the name of Jesus. We are called to profess Him as our Lord and to share Him with others. Now, I think we'd all agree that there is a time and a place for this, which is why we need to pray and ask the Holy Spirit to let us know when to speak and when to be silent, but there are most certainly times when we all will be asked to speak up and speak out for our Savior. How will others know if no one tells them?

Today, let's learn a lesson from the boldness and honesty of Peter—and let's be willing to share honestly when it comes to matters of faith. Pray for guidance from the Holy Spirit and ask Him to give you the words to say when you need them. Undoubtedly, you will be blessed by the Lord who loves you and empowers you to carry His name to the world.
