Reilly's goals were:

- Increase my integrity in all areas of my life
- Protect and respect my wife more
- Keep God first, even during football season
- Do checks on my stewardship of all things. Am I controlling? Worrying? Bragging? Criticizing?
- Be a servant to others
- Coach for significance

Reilly did a great job of living up to the goals he set for himself. Although he was a tremendous competitor, he was never shy about proclaiming that his priorities were God, family, and lastly, football. In spite of the fact that he taught and coached in a public school, Reilly faithfully gathered his team on the twenty-yard line and prayed before the start of every game, at halftime, and at the end of the game, win or lose.
