Looking back, I finally understand the meaning behind these lyrics. It comes from Luke 19 when Jesus enters Jerusalem and the Pharisees are angry at the amount of praise that He is given as He comes into town. The Pharisees ask Jesus to rebuke the people for their praise. Jesus replied, “*If they kept quiet, the stones along the road would burst into cheers*” (Luke 19:40).

Jesus is meant to be praised. God designed us to praise our father with all our might. Our Savior is so worthy of praise that even if we did not praise Him, He could make the rocks cry out in praise for Him. They cry out in their way of complete beauty that makes us, as observers/companions of these rocks, stand in awe.
