I was amazed. I remembered my own days playing high school basketball. If I had finished my laps first, I wouldn’t have thought about anyone else. Instead, I would have rested on a nice cool spot on the gym floor. But on this first day of coaching high school tennis, I suddenly realized that I’d be learning a lot more than I’d be teaching.

Through that young player, God taught me a lesson about kindness and sensitivity. Just as Jesus amazed the local leaders with His deeds and words, God used the unexpected to change me in a way that I could never have imagined.
