As competitors, we can sometimes be tempted to hold back what is God's for our own pleasure. But God wants us to give Him what is right, not what's left. In Luke 6:38, Jesus says:

*"Give, and it will be given to you; a good measure, pressed down, shaken together, and running over will be poured into your lap. For with the measure that you use, it will be measured back to you."*

Ananias gave what was left, not what was right. Abel gave what was right; Cain gave what was left. We have the choice every time we step onto the field: give what is right or give what's left. Most athletes give God the leftovers and keep the best for themselves.

God is not honored by our leftovers. The challenge when competing is to release all of your talents, gifts and abilities to become more like Christ on and off the field. We cannot hold back or keep some for ourselves.
