Set

On one of the last nights of camp, Dan sought out his brother to tell him that he had invited the Lord into his heart that night. He had learned from watching Jeff, whose life had been a great example of Christ.

Do you realize that someone is watching you? Be assured that they are, whether you know it or not. Is your life worthy? Are you bearing fruit and striving to know God more each day? Whether we want them to or not, people are watching to see how we will respond to what life throws our way. Jeff now sees clearly how others are watching him, and I know he will continue to do his best to walk in a manner worthy of the Lord. So, are you?
