There is simply no stewardship in locker rooms like this. No one has undertaken to make it a place fit for Christ to dwell in. Can godly stewardship of a locker room be accomplished?

One day in an NFL locker room, a new player arrived filled with passion for Jesus. Over time he inspired that small number of Christians to manage the locker room with godly principles. Effective stewardship is handled with patience; and this NFL locker room did not change overnight, but as those who profess Christ lived out their faith boldly and prayerfully, others were won over. Before long Christian music was being pumped in, and the immoral content came off the television screens. Good stewardship doesn’t mean that we are called to exercise a self-righteous agenda; rather, it is through love, gentleness, and obedience that others will want what we have.
