### **Ready:**

### **Set**

An unopened parachute is useless, and it adds weight to the fall, making your speed much higher and the blow if you hit the ground, a tree or something else much harder.

An unopened parachute is a symbol of unused knowledge. It's not about accumulating your knowledge but about using them at the right moment in obedience to the coach's desires. There is even more responsibility on a person who listens to the Word of God but doesn't use it. Reading the Bible and visiting church is like a new spiritual height that we reach. Jumping out of a plane and opening your parachute is like practical usage of the knowledge we've got from reading and listening. Or in other words, it represents "a leap of faith." If we don't use spiritual principles practically, it looks as miserable as not following your coach's guidance, and it leads you down a dark path of problems.

Embodiment and practical usage of God's Word is always an exciting adventure and even skydiving is nothing compared to it!
