

## **What Do You Desire?**

### **Ready:**

“Like newborn infants, desire the pure milk of the word, so that by it you may grown up into your salvation, if you have tasted that the Lord is good.”- 1 Peter 2:2-3

### **Set**

A few years back, I was training for a half-marathon. As the race date approached, I aimed to run 12 miles straight. If I could run 12 miles on race day, I knew I could push myself an extra mile to reach the finish line. The day I decided to run the 12 miles the sun was out and it was getting hotter by the minute. Throughout my whole run, I could only think about rewarding myself with a gold-purple Gatorade. If I completed my 12 mile goal, the first stop I was making was at the gas station down the road to buy the biggest, coldest Gatorade they had.
