### Ready:

#### Set

Back in the late 840s BC, King Jehoshaphat was informed that three huge armies were on the move with the intention of annihilating Judah. As word spread of the impending attack, residents from every town gathered together to figure out what they should do. It sure did not look promising, and they were terrified!
