Ready:

“And now, just as you accepted Christ Jesus as your Lord, you must continue to follow him. Let your roots grow down into him, and let your lives be built on him. Then your faith will grow strong in the truth you were taught, and you will overflow with thankfulness.” -- Colossians 2:6-7

Set

There is nothing better than getting to know God better and seeing Him answer prayer.

Meet with People

God created us for community, and He knows how we can encourage one another, disciple and grow together. When we are united in Christ, we are His hands and feet, charged with lending a helping hand to someone in need, offering a place of refuge and

sharing the love of Christ with a world in need of His light. The more we grow together, the greater the Kingdom impact.

Let's build our lives on Him who is our cornerstone. Let His strong roots entwine with yours for Kingdom service. Pour out your heart for Him, so when challenges come, you won't only be ready, but you will have a solid foundation from which to face them.
