Whether they are random accidents like injuries or whether they are the results of man's sinfulness like in a gossiping, rumor-starting teammate, we can trust Him as our protector, provider, healer and Savior.

Today, no matter what you're going through, rest assured in the sovereignty and faithfulness of God. Whether we can fully understand it or not, He does know what we're going through and He has made a way for ultimate blessing if we trust Him. Let that be our mantra today: “Lord, I trust You. Please see me through.”
