Peter was also known for being a little hasty with his words. When Jesus told the disciples that they would all turn their backs on Him Peter replied boastfully, "Even if all fall away, I will not" (Mark 14:29). The fact is that Peter not only disowned Jesus once, but three times that very night.

How many times have we made empty promises to God? "Lord, just get me out of this situation, and I promise I'll never do this again." "I'll read my Bible everyday, I promise." The Bible warns us in Ecclesiastes chapter 5 about making hasty commitments to God that lead to unfulfilled promises. "It is better not to vow than to make a vow and not fulfill it" (Ecclesiastes 5:5).

I encourage you today to think through the words you speak to others and to the Lord, and then follow through with what you say.

"Do not be quick with your mouth, do not be hasty in your heart to utter anything before God. God is in heaven and you are on earth, so let your words be few" (Ecclesiastes 5:2).
