Pride always comes before a fall. Uzziah's fall began when his disobedience led to leprosy, which led to his spiritual and ultimate defeat. God reminded Uzziah every day through his leprosy, "Never forget, I am still The Man!"

Have we forgotten who The Man truly is? Too many of us today say, "I'm the man" and puff out our chests. We reek of pride! Only He is The Man. We must not forget who created us and why—to serve Him and glorify Him in all we do.
