While much of the world defines athletic success in terms of wins and losses, legendary coach John Wooden writes in his book, *Coach Wooden’s Pyramid of Success* that “success is peace of mind that is the direct result of self-satisfaction in knowing you did your best to become the best that you are capable of becoming. Within this framework, each person becomes the only one who can ultimately judge his or her own success.”

Spiritually speaking, I believe success is faithfully striving to be fully obedient to God and His Word in all areas of our lives. Based on this, there are three things required for success: (1) we must have a relationship with God, which only comes through faith in Jesus Christ; (2) we must know His Word, which means we have to actually read the Bible; (3) we must strive to live in obedience to God, which means taking His Word and applying it to our lives.

We know, and God knows, that we are going to make mistakes, but if we are making a sincere effort to follow God and be all that He calls us to be, then we are successful.
