Set

I have been a wife and a mother for almost 16 years. Before that I was a sister, daughter, student, friend. I was genuinely bad at volleyball, but I loved to try, so I was part of a team, maybe a jock? That might be too generous... But I always identified myself by who I was to someone else.

I was coming out of depression and was trying to regain what I had lost to it. I was just beginning to start to pray again, be in the Word again. It was difficult. When you take time away from anything there is that "it's like riding a bike" feeling, but with a spiritual life, it's like relearning to ride a bike but knowing that the 10 speed from before will never be good enough for your now.

My identity has always been in Christ, whether I call myself out or not. He knew me from before I was in the womb (Jeremiah 1:5). He was with me, formed me before I was born (Psalm 139:13).
