Proverbs 12:3

Set

I fell in love with basketball when I was five years old. All I ever wanted to do was shoot hoops outside, jump rope to improve my foot speed and watch clips of Michael Jordan. I used to fall asleep to a CD that played the Chicago Bulls starting lineup introduction song. I was known as the girl who played basketball, who missed school dances for recruiting trips and disappeared in the summer for weeks at a time to play in tournaments. Then I went to college to play and wrapped myself in this identity even further. Who was I without a ball in my hand?

As I’ve transitioned out of my athletic career, there’s been a lot of lies swirling around in my head. That without basketball I’m not good enough; I’m unworthy, unseen, unloved, and unheard. But Proverbs 12:3 says the righteous cannot be uprooted. So, I get to cling to what I know to be true, The Lord, who parted the Red Sea, who turned water into wine, knows how many hairs are on my head, how many stars are in the sky, who walked on the water, died on the cross, and would have done so if only for ME, if only for YOU.
