“In the sixth month of Elizabeth’s pregnancy, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a village in Galilee, to a virgin named Mary. She was engaged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of King David.” -- Luke 1:26-27

Set

When we think about the story surrounding Jesus birth, it’s usually the major events that stand out the most: the angel coming to Mary, her long journey on a donkey, the lack of rooms in the inn, the star that the wise men followed, and even how Jesus was swaddled in a manger. But what about all of the major details that we overlook? Joseph and Mary were no doubt a team chosen by God and immediately hit with trial and adversity from the very start, but they chose to stay together as one and to trust God.

The angel was clear to Mary when he greeted her as being favored by God and made sure that she knew God was with her. As a team, Joseph and Mary continued to follow their coach because they knew He would not ever stop leading them and they knew that God had incredible blessings and plans for them as a team.

As Christian competitors, we know that it isn’t always easy to listen to our coaches and it isn’t always easy to follow God either. When we choose to follow God, we make Him our Head Coach, and despite complex or difficult instruction, we can fully rely on the fact that God truly has the very best plan in mind. He not only desires to lead us, but he desires to bless us all along the way. Just as Mary and Joseph trusted and followed God’s every word and instruction to them, we can confidently follow Christ because we know He loves us and we know He is for us.
