“As I urged you when I went to Macedonia, remain in Ephesus so that you may instruct certain people not to teach false doctrine or to pay attention to myths and endless genealogies. These promote empty speculations rather than God’s plan, which operates by faith.” – 1 Timothy 1:3-4

Set

It would be similar to seeing a fortune teller to figure out where you should go to college. Timothy told them that no one can tell you of God’s plan. The closest access we can get is to have faith.

Faith doesn’t look like answers; it looks like trust that God will be with you through the process. Faith doesn’t tell you where to go to college or what career path to take. Faith is trusting that God has a plan we don’t need to know. All we need to know is God Himself.
